Annual Ham Radio Event to be Held at Saddleback Butte State Park

Lancaster, CA— April 1, 2025 — Every fourth weekend in June is ham radio's open house. It's called "Field Day" and this year it will be held on Saturday and Sunday, June 28 & 29. More than 31,000 "Hams" (Amateur Radio Operators) throughout North America will set up temporary transmitting stations in public places to demonstrate ham radio's science, skill and service to our communities and our nation. It combines public service, emergency preparedness, community outreach, and technical skills all in a single event. Field Day has been an annual event since 1933 and remains the most popular event in ham radio. The Antelope Valley Amateur Radio Club (AVARC) participates every year, and this June will be stationed at the Saddleback Butte State Park in east Lancaster.

Radio Connects

The theme for 2025 Field Day is "Radio Connects" — highlighting the many ways that wireless technology connects people across distances near and far. The event is part picnic, campout, practice for emergencies, informal contest, and most of all, fun!

A "Get-On-The-Air (GOTA)" station will be available for new and non-hams alike to experience amateur radio and make contact with other stations around the country and around the world. This is also a great opportunity for Scouts to visit and earn one of the more elusive signoff's on their Radio Merit Badge.

Saddleback Butte State Park

The park is open to the public and operators will be available to answer your questions and demonstrate the capabilities of Amateur Radio. The State Park day-use fee for vehicles is \$6. Alternatively, the public can park along East Ave K east of 170th St East and make the short quarter-mile hike to the group campground. The park has a nature trail and a strenuous hike to the top of Saddleback Butte which offers amazing views of the Antelope Valley and the Mohave Desert.
